

## Licensing Permission Agreement and Release Form

1. As a speaker for an annual meeting symposium, workshop, or special lecture, educational course, or webinar Presentation (defined below), I grant to the Society for Birth Defects Research and Prevention (BDRP) the following (check one):

a non-exclusive, irrevocable, worldwide, sublicensable, royalty-free license to use, photograph, video and audio record (tape and/or digital), reproduce, modify, broadcast, post to the BDRP website, sell, sell access to, and otherwise distribute and make available the Presentation and all handouts, PowerPoint presentations, or other materials I provide to BDRP in connection with the Presentation (the “Materials”), with appropriate attribution to me;

an exclusive, royalty-free license to make available the Presentation with handouts, PowerPoint presentations, or other materials I provide to BDRP in connection with the Presentation (the “Materials”) for **120 days, to only annual meeting/course/webinar registrants and/or BDRP members**, with appropriate attribution to me.

I understand that I retain copyright ownership of the Materials and the underlying content of the Presentation, which I may continue to use (or allow others to use) in any way.

2. I represent and warrant that neither the Presentation nor the Materials (i) infringe upon the copyright, trademark, privacy, proprietary, or personal rights of any third party; (ii) contain any defamatory material; or (iii) are otherwise unlawful. I further represent and warrant that the Presentation and the Materials are factually accurate and that I have obtained all necessary signed permissions or licenses from any individuals or organizations whose material is included or used in the Presentation and the Materials. I further represent and warrant that I have full authority to enter in this Agreement and Release. I shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless BDRP and its affiliates, subsidiaries, shareholders, members, directors, officers, employees, and agents from any claim, suit, or action by any third party.
3. I authorize BDRP to use and reproduce my name, likeness, photograph, and biographical information in connection with the use and promotion of the event in which I will present the Materials and Presentation and to display the same on the BDRP website.
4. I understand and agree that I am encouraged to use the designated and BDRP-provided PowerPoint template (which incorporates BDRP’s logo and other intellectual property) in connection with my provision of Materials and the Presentation. I agree not to use the BDRP PowerPoint template in any way other than in connection with the Presentation and Materials provided for the Program.
5. I agree to comply with Presentation-related deadlines provided to me by BDRP, including but not limited to deadlines for information, handouts, and slides and upon written request, to provide BDRP with a copy of my Presentation and Materials not less than **30 days** prior to the date of Presentation for review by BDRP
6. I agree to notify the BDRP immediately in the event that an emergency beyond my reasonable control should prevent me from meeting my obligation as a presenter.

7. During my Presentation, I will not engage in any type of promotional marketing or selling of any product or service, nor will I state or infer that the statements I make or positions I present in my Presentation are those of or endorsed by the BDRP.

# BDRP Licensing Permission Agreement and Release Information

**BDRP requires that all presenters return the Licensing Permission Agreement and Release Form.**

If you use material that you did not create yourself and for which you do not hold the copyright or that has been previously published, you must **obtain a written copyright release** from the copyright holder or owner of this material. Proper attribution for this material must be included in your presentation and, if your presentation is part of an education course, the course book.

This is for your own legal protection as well as that of BDRP and is taken very seriously. Any information included in your slides should be treated as a published work. Any data or image that you would not include in a published article without proper permissions should also not be included in your slides.

Almost all journal articles online have an option for securing copyright permissions through an automated process. Select options for “get rights and content,” “copyright permissions,” etc. The exact wording depends on the publisher.

## **Why do I need to complete the BDRP license release?**

In disseminating information, it is important that BDRP protects the intellectual property rights of others and of BDRP. BDRP claims ownership for materials produced by BDRP, such as a course book, so it is requested that contributors give permission for use of their work and acknowledge that the content of the contributed materials is copyright free or that the contributor has permission to use any materials that are under copyright.

## **I am a state or federal government employee. What obligations do I have?**

Government agencies usually retain a nonexclusive, royalty-free license to publish or reproduce work that is produced by employees, and they permit others to use and publish that work without further licensing or fees. By signing the License Release, you are certifying that BDRP is free to use the material without infringing upon the rights of another entity.

## **The materials for the presentation were prepared as part of my job. Is it still necessary to complete the form?**

Yes. By completing and signing the form, you are confirming that you are authorized by your employer to transfer licensing rights to these materials and that your employer has consented to all the terms and conditions of the agreement.

## **How do I know if I need copyright permission?**

If any material in your presentation is taken directly from another source, you need permission of the author/publisher to use that material. However, if you take data from multiple sources, for example, and create a new table, that is your work, and you would cite the source of the data but would “own” the new work. If an image you created was published and the publisher retained copyright, you could not use that image without a copyright release. However, you could use a similar image you created that had not been previously published.

## **Is copyright permission needed for images found on the Internet?**

Images, website screenshots, photographs, and text derived from Internet sources may be copyrighted and cannot be used without permission and attribution. Some sites do have statements allowing free use, use for educational purposes, or other guidelines. It is important to track the source of material and the use the statement on that site and proceed accordingly. Unless explicitly stated otherwise, the assumption is that materials are copyrighted or were borrowed without attribution/permission. Some materials are in the public domain and may be used freely. For example, US law defines the interval for intellectual property rights on some materials, and once expired, those materials may be used freely.

## **I am using a photograph of a person. Are there any special cautions?**

If the photo is copyrighted, you would follow the appropriate procedures to get permission for use, which may involve a fee. In regard to photos that you own or someone else owns, before BDRP use, you need to secure proof that the person gives permission for the use of their image.
